IQAC of the college regularly holds meetings, takes stock of the academic and cocurricular activities of the college, gathers feedback in informal manner and provides help and guidance to the departments of the college in quality enhancement. IQAC works as a useful link between various stake holders and facilitates the smooth functioning of the activities of the college.

### The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC and its outcome at the end of the year:

#### • To organize one national/state level seminar during the year.

Seminars and conferences are an important tool for educational excellence and research. Hence, IQAC encouraged the faculty members not just to attend seminars and conferences but also to organize such events in the institution so that students can be provided exposure to academic research activity. This year Home Science faculty has organized one state/national level seminar. The details are in Para 8 of Part B of this report.

# • To set up a language laboratory in the institution to impart better teaching of English.

Last year IQAC proposed to set up a language laboratory in the college. A proposal to set up a language laboratory in the college is approved by the management and efforts are on to garner financial support from the government. The state government has a scheme to aid colleges to set up language laboratories in the colleges. We expect a positive reply from the government failing which we shall mull the option of availing financial support from UGC under the XI<sup>th</sup> plan.

## • To discourage the use of chalk and talk method in the classroom and to encourage to make the classroom more interactive and participatory.

IQAC has realized the need to make classrooms more meaningful and relevant. It is extremely urgent that students see the classroom as a place for academic pursuit. To make classroom more interesting and participatory, IQAC intends to accelerate its efforts to involve use of audio-visual aids and reduce dependence on chalk-n-talk method. We have been successful in making classroom more interactive and participatory. Teachers use classroom discussions, students' seminars, assignments, quizzes etc. to generate interest in the students. IQAC continues to encourage faculty members to use audio-visual aids and computers, e-resources and internet for regular classroom teaching.

# • To ensure useful involvement of alumnae association in the development of the college.

IQAC shall try to strengthen the activities of the alumnae association. We intend to involve their active role in the activities of the college. However, as decided earlier,

such help and assistance will be in the form of expertise and knowledge and not in the form of financial help.

• To accelerate the activity of career counseling and placement cell in the institution to generate awareness about career opportunities in various fields and to equip students to make the most of the opportunities available to them.

Career Counseling and Development Center of the college needs further boost to streamline its activities and make it more effective. IQAC shall provide necessary support and impetus to intensify the activities of the cell.

## • To organize and/or to be host to various sports competitions in the institution.

IQAC realized that organizing university and state level sports competitions can provide exposure to our students that would help them a lot. Interacting with participants from other colleges ignites their minds to achieve higher and higher in the areas of their interest. In view of this IQAC decided to organize and/or host university level sports competitions. This year the college was host of Inter College Judo Competition of the Saurashtra University. The details of the competition are given in Para 33 of Part B of this report.

• To organize and /or to be host to and/or to constitute bodies or forums in the institution to organize exhibitions, rallies, and such other programmes to make students aware about the various current issues pertaining to social justice, environment, women empowerment, gender equality, scientific approach to life, etc.

An HEI has a significant role to play in sensitizing their students about environment. It is essential that an HEI develops love of nature in its students and makes them aware about the problems and hazards of environment degradation so that the students see the importance of eco-friendly life style. We have set up a Nature Club in the college to fulfill this duty. Various programmes such as rallies, exhibitions, film shows etc. were organized during the year to make students aware about the various current issues pertaining to social justice, environment, women empowerment, gender equality, scientific approach to life, etc. The details of the activities are in relevant Para of Part B of this report.

## • To make student feedback and self-appraisal mechanism a regular feature of institutional monitoring.

The institution has pre-printed feedback forms students evaluation of course and classroom activities. We have also prepared self-appraisal forms for teachers. The system is now in place.

• The institution wishes to start Post Graduation courses in Chemistry and Microbiology. The proposals are already in the pipeline and a nod from the University is expected soon.

The institution had decided to start post graduation programme in Chemistry and Microbiology. A proposal was forwarded to the University for the same. However, the university offers self-financed courses only which was not found to be viable by the institution. Hence, we have dropped this proposal. However, a fresh proposal to start B. Sc. in Biotechnology is under consideration.

• We intend to start short term institutional courses on various professional skills such as beauty treatment, fashion designing, tailoring etc.

Two short term workshops on Machi-work and Food Preservation were conducted during the year.

• The institution wishes to make CCC or CCC+ training compulsory for all employees for computer literacy.

Four of the administrative staff has cleared CCC examination.

• We understand the importance of value education. We shall organize various activities and lectures in collaboration with various NGOs and individuals.

35 students registered and participated in 'Vijay hi Vijay' workshop organized by Vivekananda Centre, Rajkot. 24 students appeared the test held on 10/10/2008 and 11 got through and were selected for one day seminar. Students also participated in three day workshop on value education organized by Saurashtra University, Rajkot on 29<sup>th</sup> January to 31<sup>st</sup> January 2009. Introductory Talk on *YES*!+ (Youth Empowerment and Skills) was conducted on 28<sup>th</sup> Nov.08. The speaker was Dr. Krishna Upadhyay, World Alliance for Youth Empowerment, Art of Living International Centre.

• A lecture series is planned in collaboration with Bureau of Indian Standards to generate awareness about quality parameters and consumer protection.

We could not organize this lecture series due to lack of inputs from Bureau of Indian Standards.

#### Detail the plans of the institution for the next year.

IQAC has chalked out a plan of action for the institution for the academic year 2009-10. The details are as follows:

#### **\*** Plan for infrastructure development:

The institution has the following plan for infrastructure development for the next year. However, some of these may carry over for a couple of years as they are slightly long term programmes. The institution wishes to start the procedure for the following infrastructure developments.

- Library building: The institution needs a separate library building. At present the college library is housed in a large room in the college building itself. The present arrangement is not sufficient in view of the growing needs of the institution. The library needs more space for stacks and more arrangement for reading room. The college plans to build a new library building.
- Teaching of English has become very important with both the university and the state government giving special emphasis to English language teaching. The latest syllabi of English for all the under graduate classes in science faculty has a portion for spoken English necessitating the use of language laboratory for the effective transaction of syllabi. The department of English has forwarded a proposal through the institution to the state government for setting up a language laboratory in the college. The state government has a scheme for providing financial assistance to the colleges for setting up a language laboratory. We are optimistic about the proposal failing which we shall mull the option of availing financial support from UGC under the XI<sup>th</sup> plan.
- The institution wants to build a well furnished and well equipped seminar hall.
- The institution wishes to update its sports infrastructure. We wish to update and increase our infrastructure facilities.

#### **\*** Academic Plans:

The institution has the following plan for academic development during the next academic year:

- The institution has forwarded a proposal to the university for starting B. Sc. in Biotechnology. The proposal is already in the pipeline and a nod from the University is expected soon.
- Next year, we intend to start bridge courses on various professional skills such as Food Preservation, Canning & Bottling etc.
- The institution will organize a three day workshop on "Curriculum Development in Nanotechnology and Science" with UGC grants.
- We understand the importance of value education. We shall organize various activities and lectures in collaboration with various NGOs and individuals.
- Various departments of the college organize lectures, demonstrations, fieldwork tours, camps such as bone density check-up camp, check-up camps for women health, exhibition-cum-sale, income generating programmes, creativity workshop, art workshop, various competitions, as part of extension and curricular activities.
