IQAC of the college regularly holds meetings, takes stock of the academic and cocurricular activities of the college, gathers feedback in informal manner and provides help and guidance to the departments of the college in quality enhancement. IQAC works as a useful link between various stake holders and facilitates the smooth functioning of the activities of the college.

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC and its outcome at the end of the year:

IQAC has chalked out a plan of action for the institution for the academic year 2010-11. The details are as follows:

Plan for infrastructure development:

The institution has the following plan for infrastructure development for the next year. However, some of these may carry over for a couple of years as they are slightly long term programmes. The institution wishes to start the procedure for the following infrastructure developments.

• Library building: The institution needs a separate library building. At present the college library is housed in a large room in the college building itself. The present arrangement is not sufficient in view of the growing needs of the institution. The library needs more space for stacks and more arrangement for reading room. The college plans to build a new library building.

The institution has started work on the proposal. The plans and drawings for the building are ready. Certain financial constrains have delayed the beginning of construction work. But the new library building is very much in the priority list of the institution.

• Setting up a language lab in the college

Teaching of English has become very important with both the university and the state government giving special emphasis to English language teaching. The latest syllabi of English for all the under graduate classes in science faculty has a portion for spoken English necessitating the use of language laboratory for the effective transaction of syllabi. The department of English has forwarded a proposal through the institution to the state government for setting up a language laboratory in the college. The state government has a scheme for providing financial assistance to the colleges for setting up a language laboratory. The government has sanctioned a language lab to the institution and we believe by the end of December 2011 the lab would be commissioned and in use.

• The institution wants to build a well furnished and well equipped seminar hall.

The institution has started work on the proposal. The management has assigned work to architect to draw a plan for the same.

• The institution wishes to update its sports infrastructure. We wish to update and increase our infrastructure facilities.

A proposal to set up a basketball court and cricket pitch in the college has been forwarded to the UGC.

Academic Plans:

The institution has the following plan for academic development during the next academic year:

• The institution intends to start Microbiology as core course in the first and second semester and Physics as an elective subject in third and fourth semester under the CBCS regime.

The institution has offered Microbiology and students were admitted during the current year i.e. 2010-11. Physics, Botany and Zoology courses for semester-III and IV will be offered and students would be admitted from the academic year 2011-12.

• Next year, we intend to start crash courses on various professional skills such as Food Preservation, Canning & Bottling etc.

Various departments organized crash course. The details of the same are in Part B Para 8.

• The institution will organize a national conference on "Environment and Climate".

The national conference was organized by the Biology department of the college in collaboration with International Society of Science and Technology (ISST), Mumbai on 13th February, 2011 and had a grand success. Participants from across the country participated in it.

• We understand the importance of value education. We shall organize various activities and lectures in collaboration with various NGOs and individuals.

Various departments of the college organize lectures, demonstrations, fieldwork tours, camps such as bone density check-up camp, check-up camps for women health, exhibitioncum-sale, income generating programmes, creativity workshop, art workshop, various competitions, as part of extension and curricular activities.

36. Activities of the Guidance and Counseling unit:

The CCDC of the college has been allotted a separate office with computer and internet facility.

- The CAREER COUNSELING AND DEVELOPMENT CENTRE (CCDC) of Saurashtra University organized a seminar on career in airlines sector on July 21, conducted the seminar.
- A workshop on "Youth Empowerment and Personality Development" was organized under the auspices of AMA (Ahmedabad Management Association), Ahmedabad on August 27, 2010
- A three month programme on communicative English was conducted under the UMMID programme of Government of Gujarat on January 20, 2011.

39. Best practices of the institution:

Empowerment of women has been the main goal of the institution from its inception. The programmes and activities are generally in conformity with the mission, goals and objectives of the institution.

- The college has established an Internal Quality Assurance Cell after its accreditation in 2007.
- A broad plan of activities and events of the college is given through academic calendar.
- The college is represented at the Board of the studies of the University by the heads or senior members of the departments. One member of teaching staff is holding the position of Other than the Dean in Science faculty. They all play a vital role in designing and revising syllabi.
- The college conducts national, state and local level seminars, workshops, conference bringing in academic peers to share their expertise and inspire students.
- The college has linkages with other colleges and Red Cross useful for teacher exchange and field trips and demonstrations.
- Admissions to the various courses of study in the college are in accordance with the policy of the university.
- Lecture method is generally used for teaching and it is supplemented by classroom seminars, discussion quizzes and online study material. PowerPoint presentation is made available with the acquisition of multimedia projector.
- Weak students are identified and necessary coaching is provided in subjects like English, General home Science, Food and Nutrition etc.
- A broad teaching plan is provided by the teacher at the beginning of the semester and its implementation is monitored by the head of the department. Teaching and activity plans are prepared at the end of the year for the following year.
- Evaluation is done as per norms and guidelines of the university laying stress on continuous internal assessment. Orientation given to the students at the beginning of the semester to give them the idea on the pattern of evaluation followed in the college.
- The college has been consistently maintaining high success rate, having a few university ranks to its credit.
- The college appoints teachers on clock hour basis where ever workload is heavy and as and when there are inadequate numbers of teachers in any department.
- Teachers are given opportunities to attend and present papers in seminars, conferences and workshops within and outside the state.

- Clubs such as Nature Club and study circles help interested students to involve themselves in related activities. Cultural programmes and various competitions are organized to bring out latent talents of students.
- The college encourages teachers to avail FIP of the UGC for Minor Research Programme.
- The library has around 4800 books and 22 magazines. The library has linkages with the library in a sister concern, Christ college and N-list.
- The college has a UGC Network Resource Center which is kept open for seven hours a day.
- There is a canteen facility.
- There is a suggestion box wherein students can drop their suggestions/complaints and these suggestions/ complaints are taken into consideration and solved by the college.
- The fresher are provided with updated prospectus and are given orientation to familiarize themselves with the institution and its programmes and activities.
- The college has been collecting feed back from the final year students and a feedback mechanism is developed and strengthened.
- The college has a formal Career Counseling and Development Cell that holds interactive career counseling through workshops, seminars and coaching.
- The college avails help from the former students under the Alumnae Association for programmes or course related activities as and when needed.
- The college has NCC platoons having 101 cadets and an NSS unit No.2 having 107 volunteers, very active in community oriented extension activities.
- Financial aid in the form of scholarship is made available to ST, SC and OBC students from Gujarat State Government.
- College has completed one year of its magazine "Spectrum" a quarterly magazine for in-house circulation.

IQAC has chalked out a plan of action for the institution for the academic year 20010-11. The details are as follows:

***** Plan for infrastructure development:

The institution has the following plan for infrastructure development for the next year. However, some of these may carry over for a couple of years as they are slightly long term programmes. The institution wishes to start the procedure for the following infrastructure developments.

- Library building: The institution needs a separate library building. At present the college library is housed in a large room in the college building itself. The present arrangement is not sufficient in view of the growing needs of the institution. The library needs more space for stacks and more arrangement for reading room. The college plans to build a new library building.
- Teaching of English has become very important with both the university and the state government giving special emphasis to English language teaching. The latest syllabi of English for all the under graduate classes in science faculty has a portion for spoken English necessitating the use of language laboratory for the effective transaction of syllabi. The present Network Resource Center is still in the process of up gradation and will be used as language laboratory.
- The institution wants to build a well furnished and well equipped seminar hall.
- Two class room will be equipped with multimedia projectors.
- The institution wishes to update its sports infrastructure. We wish to update and increase our infrastructure facilities.

Academic Plans:

The institution has the following plan for academic development during the next academic year:

- Home Management department wishes to arrange "Kanuni Shibir"
- Microbiology department plans to carry out student Anemia Report to create awareness among students regarding hemoglobin percentage.
- Next year, we intend to start bridge courses/workshops on various professional skills such as Food Preservation, Canning & Bottling etc.

- We understand the importance of value education. We shall organize various activities and lectures in collaboration with various NGOs and individuals.
- Various departments of the college will organize lectures, demonstrations, fieldwork tours, camps such as bone density check-up camp, check-up camps for women health, exhibition-cum-sale, income generating programmes, creativity workshop, art workshop, various competitions, as part of extension and curricular activities. All the activities according to Saurashtra University Educational & Sports calendar and given by the Gujarat Government under Swarnim Gujarat will be organized.
- CCDC of the college shall organize a workshop/seminars for skill development and orientation for various careers. These would includes events such as –
 Computer training through CCC (Course in Computer Concepts)
 Communicative English
 Preparation for competitive Examinations
 Orientation and training for printing Technology
 Public Speaking
 Animation
- SCOPE of the college shall impart training in English for ESOL (Cambridge University) Certification.
